There was once a yid (who was not 'frum') (we will call him Mike) that got close to the shliach in Antwerp. He made it very clear to the shliach that he is not interested in yidishkeit and he is just fine being married to a not Jewish lady (r"l) and therefore the shliach should not talk to him about yidishkeit at all.

It happened once that Mike hosted a Farbrengen in his house, and because of lack of room he sat on the windowsill listening to what was being said at the farbrengen. The shliach that was Farbrenging was very into what he was saying and his face was red like a

fire burning! He said l'chaim and all the chevre started singing a nigun together. The more they sing, the more emotional they got, the more their hearts opened. Everyone was thinking about where he is holding in Avodas Hashem, in what could he change for the better. In short a serious farbi.

At a certain point, the shliach sees Mike sitting on the windowsill, and tears were rolling down his cheeks! The shliach understood that something is going to change in Mike tonight, but he didn't realize how much...After the Farbrengen Mike motions to the shliach to follow him. They walk into Mike's bedroom where his not Jewish wife is sitting on a chair reading a book. Mike moves a bookcase and there was a safe in the wall, he opens the door & takes out all the money that was there (\$20,000), Mike turns to his not Jewish wife and asks here: "could you do me a favor? "Sure" she an-



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swers. "take this money and get out of my house!" "What?! Why?!" And Mike looks at her and says: "because I'm Jewish and you're not!"...

Levi came rushing in to the offices, threw off his whistle he was still wearing since camp, dropped all of his notebooks on one of the desks, quickly grabbed a cup of freshly squeezed orange juice, and plopped down on the couch next to me. Fast asleep.

FHCLGS: (picks his head up slowly) no kidding, with this new job they got me doing, I haven't slept in months!

CHN: New job??

FHCLGS: You know, the head counselor job...

CHN: Head counselor job? What? Wait, do you mean...no way, it can't be. Your going to be head counselor of camp this year??

FHCLGS: Indeed, but I trust you that this stays between us.

CHN: I don't believe this, an interview with the future head counselor of Chayolei, it can't be real, I was so not ready for this. How did it happen?

FHCLGS: I'll tell you quickly, but then we really got to start with the interview, I'm already late to a meeting with Shimmy. Being late to one of these meetings is not the most exciting thing.

CHN: No problem.

FHCLGS: Well, it all started as I was standing by the busses waving good bye to the campers as the busses started driving away, I then

slowly started walking towards my bunk house deep in thought about the amazing summer that we had.

It was the sound of someone calling my name, that took me out of my thoughts. I looked around and didn't see anyone there. No campers were there to complain about sports, who could it be calling me, again, I heard that familiar voice, that's when I realized that it was coming from my radio.

On the third call I recognized the voice, it was the Camp Director, oh no! he probably wants to talk to me about the sports equipment (???) there's no way I'm walking around camp now cleaning up all that stuff, all the mitts and balls, absolutely no way. I'm getting out of here.


That's when I heard my name again, this time it wasn't coming from the radio. I turned around and there he was, standing less than ten feet away from me, "levi, levi, we gotta talk" I knew what that meant. I was in trouble, he's here, so faster than you could say the-CampDirector I thought of an idea, only a few feet away was

HCMYDWS'S golf cart I ran towards it, and sped off, I was heading towards my bunk house. I ran inside quickly grabbed my suitcase and in three seconds I was already back in the golf cart with Shea Lishner running after me while munching on whatever was left over in the canteen.

I sped towards the exit of camp, and that's it, I was out of camp, away from him, now he for sure wouldn't run after me. I drove as fast as I can. But after a short while I was out of gas, at the next gas station I stopped to fill up.

As I was paying, flying down the highway was camp's jeep, with the Camp Director sitting inside. I was shocked. He didn't give up. He was still chasing me, quickly leaving my change in the gas station I jumped back into the golf cart and sped off, the chase was on.

We were driving so fast that we even sped by the busses with all the campers who left about a half hour before us! In less than an hour, exactly 47 minutes and 98 seconds we



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THE ADVENTURES OF Zalmy & Zeidy

Or:

Purim thru-out the ages.

As is my usual custom to visit my grandfather after the Friday night meal, so this past Friday night I went over there for some cookies and tea and to hear a story or three.

My grandfather was sitting peacefully on the couch reading the Beis Moshiach magazine. When I walked in and jumped on his lap he was very happy to see me, as always.

When I asked him to tell me a story he obviously responded "yes" and he began:

Well, being that this week we will be celebrating the holiday of Purim, I would like to tell you about my first Purim that I was privileged to attend the Rebbe's Farbrengen it was in the year 5712-תשי"ב, there were many interesting things that took place during this special Farbrengen.

One thing I can recall is that in middle of the Farbrengen the Rebbe instructed that everyone should go out of their personal

boundaries ("ארויס פון הגבלות") after saying that the Rebbe turned his hat backwards, obviously, me, and the rest of the younger bochurim did the same, the Rebbe then instructed that everyone present should also do so. The married chassidim ("yungerlait") immediately obeyed, when the Rebbe turned to the older chassidim and said "Nu.." they too joined in.

My uncle who was also spending Shabos at Zeidy's, overheard our conversation and came in to share his own story about Purim, "I once read it in a book..." it was in the year 5713-תשי"ג Stalin (ימ"ש) who was ruling Russia at the time was planning something terrible against the Jews living in Russia.

At the Purim Farbrengen that year the Rebbe stood up and said the following story, one year there were elections taking place in Russia, the Rebbe Rashab told the chassidim to go vote for a certain individual. One chossid who was

totally distant from the ways of the world and just wanted to listen to what the Rebbe Rashab has said, came to the town square and found many people chanting: Hoo-ray! Hoo-ray! What they were chanting was for the victory of one of the candidates, however the chossid thought they were saying Hoo Ra! Hoo Ra! Which in Hebrew means 'He is wicked'.

The Rebbe at the Purim Farbrengen repeated this story

a few times, the chassidim did not understand the meaning behind this, a few days later it was publicized that the leader Stalin died, and his plan against the Jews was destroyed. When chassidim investigated the matter, they discovered that at the exact minutes that the Rebbe shouted Hoo Ra! (He is wicked) Stalin's leadership fell, and he died.

I remember the year 5715-תשט"ו Zeidy continued, a special Farbrengen was taking place in

the Rebbe's room. During this farbrengen the Rebbe spoke about the great 'nisoyon' of being wealthy, after speaking about this in length the Rebbe said that whoever wants to be wealthy should raise his hand, the few people that did, wore blessed with great wealth.

The year 5718-תשח"ח, was also a year full of giluyim, a farbrengen which lasted for over eight hours

(!!!). Throughout the Farbrengen the Rebbe spoke a lot about the 'mimim of our generation, and the great *mesiras nefesh* they have. At the farbrengen the Reb-

be also spoke to chassidim very specifically and told chassidim about their ties etc.

As my grandfather finished talking about the 5718-תשח"ח Farbrengen in walked my bubby, who also had what to say.

The most remarkable Purim for me is definitely the year of 5726-תשכ"ו I remember that towards the end of the Farbrengen the Rebbe said that whoever takes upon themselves a hachlata will receive

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l'chaim from the Rebbe.

Many people came over to the Rebbe and said a hachlata and received l'chaim. Then, the Rebbe said that anyone who requests l'chaim, will be given, (כל הפושט יד נותנים לו). Slowly a few people came over to the Rebbe and requested l'chaim and they were given, but the Rebbe wanted that everyone should request. So more and more people




The Rebbe giving out l'chaim before going into the car. - Purim תשכ"ו

started coming, and the Rebbe was giving all of them l'chaim (מידו המלאה הפתוחה הקדושה הגדושה והרחבה).

When the Farbrengen was over late at night, the Rebbe left 770 in order to go home, the Rebbe was still giving out l'chaim to those who still didn't get, I remember watching from the women's section how the Rebbe's car was surrounded by chassidim who just wanted to get a little bit of l'chaim from the Rebbe's holy hand. There were chassidim standing everywhere. Even on the roof of the Rebbe's car (which was damaged, and therefore they had to bring a replacement car to take the Rebbe home).

When the Rebbe got to his house on President Street, there were hundreds of chassidim waiting for the Rebbe there, singing happy nigunim, the Rebbe gave out more l'chaim, and the Rebbe encouraged the singing, one chossid even found it fitting to make a 'kulle'. After fifteen minutes (!!!) of the Rebbe watching the chassidim sing the Rebbe returned to his house.



In the year תשל"א-5731 the President of the land of Israel Mr. Zalmen Shazar paid a visit to the Rebbe, the Rebbe gave the President a very special silver megilla case.

As I was walking out of my Zeidy's house I remembered the special purim of תנש"א-5751 where the Rebbe as a נביא told the world not to be afraid of the threats of Sadam Hussein yimach shmo.

When the whole world was terrified, there was only one voice promising good, the voice of our Rebbe, the Novie and leader of our generation, our loving father, who loves us like his personal children.

Special for us, the campers, a Farbrengen with the Rebbe, just imagine, four walls, the Rebbe, and the camp, that's it. It's about to happen.

I got there everyone was already sitting in their places, waiting for



the Farbrengen to start, at the time given, the Head counselor announced that everyone should rise to welcome the Rebbe to this special Farbrengen.

And then it happened, all the campers stood up, the niggun

started, the path was leading all the way to the open door, and then, the Rebbe walked in as Melech HaMoshiach, wow! The Rebbe, and the campers. What more could you possibly ask for.

But then there was more, the Rebbe started a maamar, explaining the deepest concepts in chasidus, to understand the great-

ness of Hashem, and even though I'm only in bunk gim-mel, I understood every word the Rebbe said, all campers are now understanding the greatness of Hashem, concepts that until now not even the biggest Tzaddikim were

able to understand.

And as usual by these Far-brengens the best meat is served. I've never tasted something like this in the times of golus, they say it's called shor habar. I remember learning about it with my teacher, but I never believed that it actually exists. But

here it is, sitting on my plate.

My counsler is saying l'chaim to the Rebbe with some wine 'yayin hamishumor' special geula wine, the Rebbe is smiling at all the campers, who proudly are singing to the Rebbe some of the songs they prepared for this special occasion...

the last moments of galus into the first moments of Geula!

Mendel: Ya, but what does simcha and dancing have to do with the geula?



Moshe: Yes, that's right in Lubavitch Yeshivas all over the world there is dancing during the month of Adar.


Mendel: Dancing every night? Wow that must be a lot of dancing. It's like 30 days!!
